7	(2) paragraph 12 of the complaint by alleging how Defendants' conduct caused Plaintiff
8	harm, and
9	(3) paragraphs 13 and 28 of the complaint regarding the facts that support the claim of
10	tortious interference.

4 .	"14A.50.060 Resale of Tickets to Events at Municipal Facilities at a Premium Price Prohibited.
5 6 7 8 9	"Tickets to all events at municipally-owned facilities, including the Memorial Coliseum, PGE Park, and the public plaza at the Rose Quarter, and tickets to all events at the Rose Garden Arena other than season tickets, shall have printed thereon the retail price thereof. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale any ticket for an event at any municipally-owned facility, or for any event at the Rose Garden Arena, at a price greater than the retail price printed thereon or at a price greater than the original retail price. Notwithstanding the above, this Section shall not be construed to prohibit service fees or charges imposed or collected by ticket outlets where service fees or charges are specifically authorized by the management of the facilities."

12	Portland City Code §§ 1.01.140 and 14A.20.050(A) now provide, and at all
13	relevant times have provided, that a violation of the Code is a public nuisance.
14	10
15	Portland City Code § 14A.20.050(B) now provides, and at all relevant times has
16	provided, that aiding and abetting a violation of the Code is deemed a violation of the Code.
17	11
18	Defendants intentionally are now maintaining, and at all relevant times have
19	maintained, Web sites on which they offer for sale tickets to events at the Rose Garden at prices
20	in excess of the retail price of the ticket. Defendants' conduct constitutes, at the least, the act of
21	aiding and abetting a violation of the Code.

23	Plaintiff has suffered a special injury from defendants' conduct. She has been
24	unable to purchase premier tickets as a result of defendants' conduct and will be unable to do so
25	in the future if defendants are permitted to continue their conduct alleged herein.
